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SLEEPAWAY CAMP

For the first summer since 2019, The Fund operated six camping programs: Camp ABC, Camp Hayden-Marks, Camp Hidden Valley, Camp Junior, Camp Mariah – the Career Awareness Camp – and Camp Tommy, as well as the Teen Leadership and Counselor-in-Training programs.

Over 300 camp staff, including many international staff and alumni of Fresh Air programs, provided a supportive environment for 1,240 campers, ages 8-15, to explore nature, develop independence, have new experiences and make new friends.

Activities included swimming, visiting the model farm, hiking nature trails, boating, guitar lessons, archery and art. All campers visited the reopened planetarium.

Campers returned home with new confidence, new skills and many stories to share with friends and family.

FRIENDLY TOWNS

In 2023, over 170 children, ages 8-18, visited volunteer host families in small towns and rural areas along the East Coast through The Fund's legacy program Friendly Towns. The program included new youth and new host families for the first time since 2019.

A visit to stay with a host family is a unique opportunity for youth to travel to a new place and have fun experiences. Families share that favorite activities include riding bikes, visiting a local lake or beach and spending time at nearby parks.

Many children form close friendships with their host families and return to visit the same host family year after year, creating lifelong connections and gaining new perspectives.

LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

The Fund's leadership programs provide our older campers with opportunities to take on more responsibility in a safe and supportive environment.

The Teen Leadership Program provides youth, ages 13-15, with communication skills, leadership development and team-building workshops. The CIT program, a leadership and staff development program for 16–17-year-olds, is an important transition on the journey from camper to counselor. The program helps teens further develop leadership and communication skills. CITs shadow counselors and are role models for younger campers.

A summer 2023 highlight for participants in our leadership programs was the Design to Thrive program, a partnership between The Fresh Air Fund and PennPraxis at the University of Pennsylvania Stuart Weitzman School of Design. The program centers around design education and involves youth in all aspects of the design process, including having a voice in what they build to contribute to the camp community. This year they built and decorated outdoor seating, tables and new camp signs.

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

During the academic year, students participate in programs that provide opportunities for mentorship and building community.

The Young Women's Giving Circle is a youth-led program which teaches young women about the importance of community service and the power of philanthropy.

The Circle of Brotherhood program provides young men with a safe and supportive space to share thoughts and discuss issues related to healthy manhood.

The Career Awareness Program is designed to help New York City adolescents understand the relationship between school and work and how to make positive choices that will impact their futures. Participants attend Camp Mariah during the summer and participate in year-round job shadowings, tutoring, camping weekends and a career fair during the school year.

The College Connections Program supports students through the application process for college and other post-secondary options. Students in 10th – 12th grade work in groups with mentors and continue to receive support during college.

Camp Junior participants stay connected during the school year and engage in programming focused on building community which takes place in the Bronx and at Camp Junior. Activities include a running club and Life Skills workshops that build connections and help campers develop SEL skills.
